# TOPIC I Transportation Update Tanner Anderson

### **2050 MTP**

T. Anderson informed the committee that Metro Analytics is working to finalize a draft financial feasibility plan while working with GDOT to finalize Universe of Projects. Once the projects list is completed, prioritization will begin. The Stakeholder & Public Outreach Meetings are scheduled for June 20, 2024, at the Government Center Building, and June 24, 2024, at the Oakland Library. The MTP Draft is expected in June/July of 2024 with its adoption in October/November 2024.

## **Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)**

T. Anderson stated that every 10 years the MPO is required to update its MOU Agreement with all jurisdictions within the MPO to reflect the most recent Census Numbers. The last update was in 2014, and this will need to be adopted before we adopt the 2050 MTP. T. Anderson reminded members of the population shifts seen over the last 10 years and the biggest shift has gone to Lee County, but the City of Albany still holds the majority.

Motion to recommend sending this to the Policy Committee for approval was made by J. Brown. Seconded by R. Griffin and approved unanimously.

# P.I. #0008384 FY24-27 TIP/MTP Amendment #2 (Signal System Upgrade @ 16 Locations Phase IV)

- T. Anderson stated that he has not heard back from GDOT's Office of Financial Management. We currently know that it will be pushed up from FY27 to FY25 but are unsure about the allocation of money for construction costs as the FY27 rates were inflated. During the presentation, T. Anderson mentioned the purpose and cost of this project. The project is for downtown traffic signals. The cost of this preliminary engineering is \$641,000.00, and the phase is 100% Federally Funded.
- T. Anderson also presented the Construction (CST) project. The cost of this project is \$4,591,852.23 and will be 50% Federally Funded, 50% Local (City of Albany).

# P.I. #0020327 FY24-27 TIP Amendment #3 (SR 520 FM Turner Field Road to Johnny Autumn/Bethel Church Road, Electric Vehicle Charging Stations)

T. Anderson stated that the Construction (CST) cost of this project is \$1,025,000 with \$820,000 in Federal funding and \$205,000 in State funding (80/20 share between Federal and State). Construction is set for FY25. There was some dialogue regarding where the charging stations would be placed, e.g. ride shares, gas stations, etc.

# P.I. #0013562 FY24-27 TIP/2045 MTP Amendment (SR 520BU FM SR 91 to CS 905/Thornton Drive)

T. Anderson stated the original project intentions were to expand Oglethorpe from 4 to 6 lanes, but the traffic does not currently warrant this. According to GDOT, the scoping phase of this project will conclude by the end of this year. They will then present, to GDOT's Office of Financial Management and Planning, different scenarios/alternatives for moving forward. The Committee brought up the Oglethorpe Bridge Project and its timeline. T. Anderson responded that it will still move forward with 4 lanes as planned.

## **FY 26 UPWP**

This document identifies our basic staffing budget for the year, planning studies and activities, such as maintaining traffic data, trip generation, staff reports for rezoning, variances, special approvals, and working with all jurisdictions to make sure that any changes would not affect the current infrastructure of our transportation system. T. Anderson further stated that there will be a call for activities in July.

# TOPIC II <u>Transit Update</u> <u>Jason Tolbert</u>

J. Tolbert provided a transit update, stating that the extension of Saturday transit hours from 2:15 to 6:00, is to begin January 2025. This extension is needed, but staffing is an issue at the present time. He further stated that Transit is in the training phase for the Trip Spark App and will be testing it on the ASU Rams Rush Transit Route soon.

- E. Broad Ave @ Turner field traffic signal upgrade Has been let
- E. Broad Ave@ Broadway traffic signal upgrade Re-Bidding
- City's Traffic Management Center preliminary designs June 27th.
- We are currently working on Street Resurfacing Phase C, using LMIG and TSPLOST Funds for 18.58 miles of roadway, with approximately 15 streets remaining.
- We are determining quantities for Street Resurfacing Phase D
- E. Broad Ave sidewalk between the railroad underpass and the traffic signal on Cordele Rd. is in the design phase

- Washington St Ext. is in the design phase.

- PI# 0008384 16-Intersections downtown, design funded by GDOT, Approved Concept Report, PFPR is complete, FFPR 5/7/2025, Letting 7/15/20'2' Southeastern Engineering
- PI# 0015401-Albany Downtown Streetscape, Approved Concept Report, PFPR is complete, FFPR 1/31/2025, Letting 7/3/2026, plans to improve five (5) streets in the city's historic commercial center.
- 3-Speed tables sites, Pearce Ave, Ingleside Dr, and Winterwood Ave, Out for bid
- SR91 Jefferson Street from Society Ave. to Broad Ave. is closed to through traffic; a Detour is in place on N. Washington St. and N. Jackson St. East and west roadways between Society Ave. and Broad Ave. will be intermittently blocked due to construction for a stormwater & sewer separate project.

# (Dougherty County) Jeremy Brown's Report:

- Bids were received for the Phase III Alley paving project and is currently under construction. Concrete Enterprises got the bid and have started on 3 of the 5 alleys.
- Hope to have procurement started on FY 22 and 23 LMIG project next week. That will before resurfacing of 45 miles of roads.
